From the Desk of District

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

With Easter and the Pentecost celebrations for 2018 now part of the past, we look forward to many events that are before us. Already during the month of April, District Apostle Helper Peter Schulte had his first introduction to some of the countries that will be added to the responsibilities of our district later this year. The visit gave him the opportunity to get to know the ministers and members in the congregations. The transfer of full responsibility for the work of God in these countries will certainly be a historic event in our district. The visit of our Chief Apostle to Brisbane on 30 September this year will bring further changes. As has already been advised, I will enter retirement and District Apostle Helper Schulte will be appointed District Apostle for the Australia District.

On Sunday 1 July the Service for the Departed will again take place in all New Apostolic congregations throughout the world. This provides us with an opportunity to offer an invitation to our "neighbour" to attend our local congregation and to further his or her understanding of life and God's offer of salvation. The understanding of so-called "life after death" is a much sought-after matter

by many people from all walks of life irrespective of many other considerations and circumstances that they may have. Please do not waste the opportunity to invite others to this occasion.

In the Pentecost service our Chief Apostle conducted in Washington DC, USA he referred to the guarantee of God's grace and love that all children of God have. This guarantee is valid for as long as the individual soul remains in a close and active relationship with God. My great concern as a parent, a grandparent, a child of God and as a responsible minister is that the younger generations of today understand this guarantee and value it. Such understanding is not brought about by giving enticements and creating pleasant environments for them but rather by providing good examples and visible direction to guide and support them through the challenges of life. It is obvious that each individual has to navigate their own way through life and take responsibility for their own decisions but no-one has to do this by themselves; guidance and strength is always available for every child of God from the Holy Spirit.

On another note, the Australia District News has now been published, in various formats, for over 40 years. In the early years, bundles of photos with captions describing various activities within our district were send to each household to circulate information. Later the publication of the magazine "from the desk of....." became the medium through which we learned of and recorded events within our district. The Australia District News then evolved into its current format in the later years still bringing news and events to us in the form of a printed magazine. Recently the English version of the international New Apostolic magazine Our Family was discontinued and was replaced by the printed magazine Community. Additionally, electronic media platforms (nac. today, nacnews etc) have been added to the availability of New Apostolic information from around the world. Huge advances in technology and its availability to individuals have been made in recent years. Smart phones and a myriad of other devices are now in common use and these support a distribution network far faster and far more economical than any former means made available. In turn, postal systems have become very expensive and

much slower than in previous times. For these reasons it has been decided that beginning with the December 2018 edition, the Australia District News will be published online only and will not be printed in a paper version. The same will apply to the Community magazine. These publications are already available online and since this was done, the majority of readers avail themselves of the electronic version rather than the printed version as the latter has a far more restricted circulation due to difficulties in distribution. We must "keep up with the times". I ask for your understanding and support in this and trust that you will continue to enjoy the information these publications provide.

Youth Convention Reunion: Easter 2018

50 years ago District Apostle Gerke, after discussions with District Apostle Kraus of Canada, made plans to commence youth conventions in Australia. The first one was held in 1968 over the Easter long weekend in Brisbane. This was followed by a second convention in Melbourne in January 1969.

Youth from Australia and New Zealand were invited to the first youth convention and made plans to travel to Brisbane for this inaugural event. One group of youth travelled from the north Queensland congregations of Wallaville, Riverleigh, Bundaberg and Maryborough on a hired coach driven by one of the local ministers. Many also travelled by car, train or aeroplane from Sydney and Melbourne.

To commemorate this wonderful milestone District Apostle Andersen, together with the Australian Apostles, then put the plan in place for a reunion weekend. All past and present youth were invited to this special event, which commenced on Good Friday with an outdoor welcome dinner, giving everyone the opportunity to catch up, reminisce and share their experiences and memories from youth conventions past. The dinner had an Italian theme and was provided by the local members and, like the loaves and the fishes, there was plenty for everyone.

Saturday provided another opportunity for fellowship and included a rehearsal and sing-a-long for all that wanted to sing and play for the Easter service.























The members were invited to return in the evening for dinner and a historic slide show which was well received and brought up many happy memories. District Apostle Andersen was interviewed by two youth and he spoke of his role models and his experiences at youth conventions, both as a youth member and as a minister. With the closing prayer the scene was set for the Easter Sunday service.

On Sunday morning the Easter service commenced with the music program and then District Apostle Andersen took his place and the divine service began. He was accompanied by District Apostle Helper Schulte and Apostles Lodewick and Williams. The service was also streamed to all of our remote and special circumstance members so that they too were involved in the event. At the conclusion of the service, Apostle Williams made mention of the fact that District Apostle Andersen had been in the Apostle ministry for 30 years, 17 of those as District Apostle.

After lunch there was an open invitation to perform in the Youth Convention Reunion Concert. There were performances from both past and current youth. Every performance was well received and applauded, and from the many comments it was evident that the concert was enjoyed by all.

The weekend concluded with comments from District Apostle Andersen and District Apostle Helper Schulte, and after the closing prayer it was time to once again say goodbye.
