The momentous visit of our Chief Apostle - which incorporated a District Apostles' Meeting - was conducted in Perth, Western Australia from 19 to 23 October 2016.

Staff from the church's international headquarters in Zurich, Switzerland began arriving already on Sunday 16th to attend to the many preparations required for the meeting which, according to church's constitution, must be conducted twice per year.

Over the next days (and nights) the Chief Apostle and the District Apostles and District Apostle Helpers from around the world, accompanied by their wives, arrived in Perth. The meeting commenced on Thursday 20 October and for a very full 2 days the matters on the Chief Apostle's agenda were discussed and dealt with.

Saturday provided a small opportunity for the delegates to experience the flavour of Australian life with a visit to a beach as part of a sightseeing tour. In the meantime, many brothers and sisters from other parts of Australia and other countries were afforded a warm welcome by the brethren of Perth as they arrived for the divine service the next day. The Perth organising team had taken it upon themselves to really showcase their city and to ensure that no-one left without lasting memories. A picnic and fellowship enabled over 500 brothers and sisters to share valuable time together.

Sunday was the day all were focussed on and it did not disappoint. The Perth sunshine warmed the Chief Apostle and his companions as they entered the Perth Concert Hall where the Sunday School children greeted them with singing and flags of all the nations. The divine service was transmitted throughout Australia, New Zealand and to some points (where technology permitted) in Fiji, Papua New Guinea and Samoa.

Our District Apostle expresses his gratitude to the brothers and sisters of Western Australia who planned, prepared and prayed for the success of this unique visit and then made it happen with true New Apostolic zeal and determination.








































































Silver Jubilee in Canberra

Thirty-eight years after the first divine service was held in Canberra, a church in the suburb of Mawson was built.

The dedication service was conducted by District Apostle Rosentreter on Sunday, 1 September 1991. The Apostles, Bishops and District Ministers from throughout Australia were invited to be present for that historic event. Due to the record rainfall during that year, construction of the church had suffered significant delays. However, even though it had been one of Canberra's wettest winters, the joy of the members of the Canberra congregation could not be dampened that day.

Twenty-five years later District Apostle Andersen, Apostles Williams and Lodewick and the District Ministers and rectors of New South Wales gathered in Canberra to celebrate the Silver Anniversary of the dedication. It was conspicuous that Canberra once again had just experienced one of its wettest winters on record. As it was 25 years ago, the member's joy was undiminished as the festive service was long anticipated

and the congregation welcomed the many visitors, including those who, as youth, helped to plant hundreds of trees in the church grounds by digging through the rocky soil.

For the anniversary service District Apostle Andersen used a text from John 9:10-11 "Therefore they said to him, "How were your eyes opened?" He answered and said, "A Man called Jesus made clay and anointed my eyes and said to me, "Go to the pool of Siloam and wash." So I went and washed, and I received sight." Through the word, the congregation was shown how we can gain sight through listening to Jesus!

After the service, everyone enjoyed fellowship lunch together and a slideshow to relive the many memories of visits by the youth, combined services at various Canberra locations and of members who have moved interstate or have since passed away. Activities in Cooma were also remembered as Canberra supported services conducted there for many years.

























NZ Youth Convention

The Piha Mill Christian Camp, nestled off the beautiful Piha beach, was the venue for the New Zealand Youth Convention 2016. Friday was a buzz of activity and laughs as the youth arrived for a long awaited weekend.

After dinner and orientation from the camp master the youth enjoyed an evening around the open fire, singing and catching up with each other. Youth were assigned to five different groups and group leaders to work with for the weekend. With youth travelling from Christchurch, Wellington, Hamilton and various parts of Auckland there were many new faces and lots of meeting and greeting that continued until midnight.

The Saturday events kicked off at 7am with an hour long walk to the local Fairy Falls, which was a great way to get the day started and soak up the beauty of Piha. Breakfast was followed by a range of outdoor activities including team work and an orienteering competition between teams.

Apostle Williams and district leaders then arrived and we started the presentation of the main topic for the day: Faith. This workshop and discussion was centred on feedback from the youth collated as a build up to the youth convention. The topic was enjoyed and the workshops gave each team points which were accumulated over the course of the weekend.

Lunch was followed by a choir practice for the Sunday service and was a good time to start reflection and some inner preparation. The next exciting event was a game of Bubble Soccer which became very interesting when the rain started, but this did not deter any of the youth from getting muddy and soaked. The afternoon was concluded with a discussion and Q&A session with Apostle Williams who answered many questions regarding his life of faith and many travels. One question prompted the Apostle to explain one of the biggest dangers for our life of faith today: we need to place a higher value in God and our life of faith over the many other activities in our lives. We need to prioritise.

The Sunday morning divine service was held at the camp hall and was a beautiful culmination of the weekend and certainly the highlight of the youth convention. The divine service was attended by 100 youth and some beautiful musical items added to the joy. The convention was concluded with lunch for all and a group picture, before everyone headed home spiritually enriched from an awesome weekend.

Apostolic Church of Qld celebrates 125 years

District Apostle Andrew Andersen, Apostle Trevor Williams and the brethren of the Mackay congregation were invited to join the celebration of the 125th anniversary of the Apostolic Church in Mackay by Apostle Clifford Flor, the office bearers and members of the Apostolic Church.

On Saturday 1 October 2016, the Apostolic Church celebrated the first visit of Apostle H. F. Neimeyer to Mackay 125 years prior to that date. It was during that visit, on Sunday 20 September 1891, that Apostle Neimeyer sealed the first souls in Mackay. He also ordained a Deacon, Brother Wilhelm Flor on that occasion.

The celebration began with a Thanksgiving service that was followed by a generously catered lunch for all. During the lunch, members of congregation's families related their memories of congregation life and experiences growing up and being part of their community. A concert that included musical items and entertaining acts was held for all, young and old to enjoy that afternoon.
