The special occasion of the visit of our Chief Apostle accompanied by all the District Apostles of the world is drawing closer. The congregations of Perth, Western Australia will host this special event in the history of the Australia District. The choir and orchestra will be made up of all who wish to participate from

anywhere within our district. Sunday School children from throughout our district are also welcome to participate. A special focus on our Chief Apostle and the District Apostles will be a feature in the next issue. A program of planned events is included in this edition.

On July 3 the New Apostolic Church worldwide conducts Service for the Departed. These special services, which we have 3 times per year, are an opportunity to especially focus on our loved ones and the many others who occupy the realms of the departed. In the last District Apostles' Meeting (in March 2016) it was noted that people around the world, irrespective of nationality, customs and

The Service for the Departed enables us to invite interested people to experience a very special event in our congregation.

The NACare Foundation is now fully functional. As the charity arm of the New Apostolic Church in the Australia District it is actively receiving donations and is also providing the "first responder" assistance to disasters in communities in our district which is its primary function. The first such situation since its inception was the disaster caused by Cyclone Winston which hit Fiji on 20 February this

year. All the moneys collected through the NACare Foundation were channeled to the communities where our members live. A special report on this is contained in this issue. Also, in future, the Australia District News will dedicate a page to the work that goes on behind the scenes of this foundation.

A tropical downpour could not hinder the joyful anticipation of all arriving in Gladstone from Saturday.

Our brothers and sisters, with their friends, filled our Gladstone church in excited anticipation of the interactive concert on Saturday evening. The concert was hosted by the small, well organised team of Gladstone brethren. The ninety-minute event was filled with musical presentations from all the congregations, interesting, humorous and inspiring anecdotes as well as short quizzes with incentive prizes that promoted good friendly rivalry and somehow left everyone feeling like winners. The concert was followed by a fellowship supper that was enjoyed by all and could not be subdued by the inclement weather.

District Apostle Andrew Andersen was accompanied by Apostle Trevor Williams and District Elder Peter Schulte for the Departed Service. The District Apostle's sermon was based on the biblical text that was given to all Apostles to serve with for that departed service: "Then the master said to the servant, 'Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled." (Luke 14: 23).

In this festive service Brother Ryan Bosshart was ordained into the deacon ministry for the Gladstone congregation and Evangelist Craig and Sister Carolyn Bosshart received the Silver Wedding blessing. The inclement weather had no effect on the joy of the blessed fellowship even when the rector's vehicle was almost grafted into the soggy church garden. All visitors departed from Gladstone very thankful to their generous warm hearted hosts.





















NACare supports Fiji brethren

Towns and villages in the Fiji islands were decimated by Cyclone Winston, the strongest recorded tropical storm to ever hit the Pacific region, during the evening of Saturday 20 February 2016. The villages in the island of northern Viti Levu, the island of southern Vanua Levu and the inhabited islands in between were hardest hit by devastating winds that reached up to 350 km per hour.

The communities were given warnings that the cyclone was approaching Suva and that it would hit between midnight and 1:00am on Sunday. Instead, the storm changed course and travelled north west, arriving seven hours earlier than anticipated. In the region of Fiji where the cyclone was most severe, families had to abandon their shaking, disintegrating homes and shelters. Completely exposed to the elements, their only refuge was to lay low and huddle in the long grass while the raging winds and torrential rains scattered their belongings across the countryside with very little of it ever to be seen again. In the wake of this frightening experience, many families learnt that they had lost absolutely everything.

As news of the devastation caused by Cyclone Winston spread around the world, many wanted to know what they could do or how they could help the communities of the Fiji islands recover from the destruction and loss that had been experienced by so many. This was very difficult to assess as all villages were isolated by large amounts of debris that covered the roads. Only after some days could District Elder Jiona Bale and our congregation leaders reach all our brethren and identify the urgently required needs of many.

The response to the call for donations was quick and generous with contributions of \$AU13,100.00 to NACare Foundation.

In the first instance the immediate basic needs of all families who had lost almost everything were addressed. NACare Foundation's primary focus was those who were remote from the major highway and who could not get to the immediate support provided by the major non-government organisations. Members and their communities were supported with basic goods that included cooking pots and kettles, and utensils for preparing meals - table knives, forks and spoons. Each family was given plates, bowls, cups and cutlery for the family. Tarpaulins were purchased to cover and waterproof temporary roofs and shelters. Buckets and bars of soap were purchased as well as the much appreciated mosquito coils. In addition, parcels of basic foods that included bags of split peas, rice and flour, coffee and tea, powdered milk and sugar were purchased for the families in need.

In Lautoka, the home of our Priest and his family had its roof ripped off and some walls badly damaged by the destructive storm. This home is used for the divine services which are held there every Wednesday evening. Temporary repairs have been done and it is proposed that a new roof will replace the temporarily repaired leaking roof and the walls will also be repaired to ensure that this home is a sound dwelling to live in and conduct services in again.

Now that the immediate needs of these communities are being met, we are identifying recovery projects that we can support the Fiji island communities with.



In Memoriam: Bishop John Green

It was with great sadness and a measure of shock that brothers and sisters throughout the Australia District and in many other parts of the world learned of the passing of Bishop John Green in the late evening of Friday, 3 June. He had been admitted to hospital only 3 days prior and was expected to respond to the treatment that he was given, but this was not to be.

John Green was born in Brisbane on 21 September 1951, the oldest of 4 boys in the Green family. As a young adult he embraced the teachings of the New Apostolic Church eventually receiving the sacrament of Holy Sealing in 1972. He married his wife Karen Barnes in 1973 and just 11 years into their marriage they embraced the call of the Heavenly Father to serve Him as a 'minister family". John was subsequently ordained as a Sub-Deacon on 22 January 1984. He received the deacon ministry on 12 May 1985 and then the priest ministry on 1 January 1986. He was commissioned as Rector of the Windsor congregation in 1987 and then moved to Sydney for business reasons in 1989. He served there as Evangelist and then District

Evangelist before being ordained as Bishop for Queensland and New South Wales on 13 January 1991.

During his 25 years of serving as Bishop he also worked extensively in a number of other countries in our district including Fiji, Papua New Guinea and Vanuatu. Bishop Green was loved by children and seniors alike and always had time for everyone. He was a zealous servant of God and when he learned of his illness he refused to allow it to hinder him from serving the Lord's work. Even when he retired from his business, he insisted on continuing his work as a Bishop. After extensive discussion and recognising his declining health condition, he finally agreed to a retirement date, but the Lord called him out of this life before that could be put into effect. We are thankful for the many gifts that he brought to our district as God's servant and he certainly occupies a very special place in the history of God's work in the Australia District. He is survived by his dear wife and faithful supporter Karen, their 2 children and 3 grandchildren.



















Qld/NSW Youth Convention

Your confirmation is a subject of great joy for your parents, your leaders, and the entire congregation. We are all very happy that you are resolved to follow the Lord.


I dedicate the following Bible text to you for your future walk of life:


