As New Apostolic Christians, we are aware of the vision and mission statements of the New Apostolic Church:

VISION: A church in which people feel at home and, inspired by the Holy Spirit and their love for God, align their lives to the gospel of Jesus Christ and thus prepare themselves for His return and eternal life.

MISSION: Reaching out to all people in order to teach them the gospel of Jesus Christ and to baptise them with water and the Holy Spirit. Providing soul care and cultivating a warm fellowship in which everyone shall experience the love of God and the joy of serving Him and others.

I was recently asked to put a few thoughts together on the topic of "Church-Congregation-Fellowship". When we ponder this theme we can see the core impulses of our New Apostolic Church vision and mission statements.

The meaning of these words can be:

CHURCH – a body or organisation of Christian believers.

CONGREGATION – a group of people assembled for religious worship.

FELLOWSHIP – friendly association especially with people who share the same interests.

The community is the greater boundary of these three. Church is part of the community, the congregation is part of the community and it is said that good fellowship is the binding factor of the community.

There are many examples of communities experiencing hardship who have rallied together in support of one another. We hear of individuals that are willing to volunteer their time and abilities to help out in such circumstances. These deeds and actions are often the beginning of friendships and gratitude that lasts for a lifetime.

So too when there is reason to celebrate; to be able to do this in the fellowship of our friends makes our joy complete.

For our communities to be strong there is a need for all of the individuals in it to want to contribute and be part of it.

As the saying goes "the more you put in, the more you get out". Also with our church, our congregation and our fellowship - the more we give our personal investment of time, talents and care the stronger and richer our community becomes for us and our neighbour.

Who holds the responsibility to bring our vision and mission statements to life? All of us! Differences within communities can sometimes have a negative effect, however we must also admit that it can add to the richness. When we all contribute in a manner which is not just imposing what we like, but also being open to the ideas of others, it allows all to contribute joyfully.

Upon the sure foundation

Chief Apostle visits the Western Pacific District

Under the banner of "Upon the sure foundation" the Chief Apostle travelled to the Western Pacific district, arriving in Apia, Samoa, late on the evening of Friday 13 September.

It was a trip that almost didn't happen; as the Chief Apostle explained to the congregation on Sunday, his passport had been sent to him from the Russian embassy but had become lost in the post. This meant he had to request that his second passport be returned from another embassy. Finally it was received, just three hours prior to his departure. It is a reminder of the challenges that our ministers sometimes face when travelling for God's work, and the importance to keep them in our prayers.

Saturday was the "day of the youth" and the Chief Apostle, together with District Apostle Schulte and Apostles Lodewick and Williams, enjoyed a presentation which included cultural dances and a kava ceremony - a traditional welcome to the official party. At the conclusion of the ceremony a group photo was taken and the group made their way into the church building for some singing and a questions and answers session.

The divine service on the Sunday was held in the government chambers and was attended by members from the four congregations in Samoa. It was a great honour to also have the Governor General of Samoa in attendance. The Chief Apostle conducted the service using a text from **1 Thessalonians 4:9**: *But concerning brotherly love you have no need that I should write to you, for you yourselves are taught by God to love one another;*

At the conclusion of the service the Chief Apostle greeted the members and shared a snack with them before travelling to the airport for a flight to American Samoa. As this involved crossing the international date line, the group travelled "back in time" and arrived on Saturday afternoon.





The second Sunday divine service of the weekend was conducted in the recently constructed Ililli church building where both congregations in American Samoa gathered together. The text used was taken from **Genesis 4:4**: *Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat. And the Lord respected Abel and his offering.*

After service, the Chief Apostle joined the congregation for lunch which was prepared by the members. This included two large cakes to celebrate the birthdays of the Chief Apostle and District Apostle. The focus then turned to the youth who entertained the group with some cultural singing and dancing, and to their delight the Chief Apostle joined in with them. This was followed by another Q&A session.

On Monday, the official group had a short tour of the island before travelling back to Samoa. This again involved crossing the date line, meaning that after a 30 minute flight they arrived on Tuesday.

The following day the Chief Apostle celebrated his 60th birthday with cake provided by the members, before travelling onto Fiji.

A divine service was conducted in the Suva church in Fiji on Thursday morning. The Chief Apostle and apostles were welcomed to the church by a Sunday School choir, with one of the young children serving as the conductor. As the church could not accommodate all the members inside a tent was set up in the grounds and the members were connected via video link. The text used on this occasion was taken from **John 12:26**: *If anyone serves Me, let him follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be also. If anyone serves Me, him My Father will honor.*





In Christchurch, the Chief Apostle, District Apostle and Apostles Lodewick and Williams were joined by District Apostle Edy Isnugroho of Indonesia, District Apostle Helper Frank Dzur of Canada, and the apostles of the Western Pacific District - Apostle Fred Wolf (Thailand), Apostles Allen Pouru and Aimol Wasimbai (Papua New Guinea) and retired District Apostle Andrew Andersen.



The weekend commenced with a morning tea event with the Christchurch congregation, and the Chief Apostle talked with those members from our district who have endured a number of disasters - both natural and terror related - in recent times. The Chief Apostle was particularly engaged with the youth and happy to answer questions from them.

On Sunday a divine service was conducted in the Christchurch Boys' High School, with a text from **Zechariah 8:22-23**: *Yes, many peoples and strong nations Shall come to seek the Lord of hosts in Jerusalem, And to pray before the Lord.' "Thus says the Lord of hosts: 'In those days ten men from every language of the nations shall grasp the sleeve of a Jewish man, saying, "Let us go with you, for we have heard that God is with you."'"*



During the service, the Chief Apostle acknowledged the passing of Apostle Hungito in Papua New Guinea last year, and the necessity to fill his role. Additionally, due to the volume of work in that region, a request had been made for an additional apostle to support the work. Accordingly, District Elders Lucas Supok and Patrick Silabe were ordained into the apostle ministry. The Chief Apostle impressed upon them to lead with a heart of love and to spread the simple message of the gospel - Jesus loves you, come!



In total, over 560 members were in attendance in the divine service in the Christchurch Boys' High School. Another 1462 were connected to the transmission in various congregations around Australia, New Zealand, and a number of other countries around the district.





Apostle Lodewick visits Solomon Islands

After arriving in Honiara - the capital of the Solomon Islands - the Apostle flew to the Western province region and met up with the area leaders for a two day condensed trip. They travelled by boat to visit the various village congregations, and conducted sealings and meetings, and enjoyed fellowship together.

From there, Apostle Lodewick went to the South Malaita area, where he again met with the leaders and visited the various village congregations. This involved more boat travel, and hours of mountain climbing. Finally, after returning to Honiara, the Apostle completed his visit with a divine service in our city congregation, White River.

In the capital city he also visited a preschool education centre run by volunteers, to gain more understanding of the situations faced by the parents and children who cannot afford this. As NACare is investigating the possibility of assisting in this sector from our White River church, this visit proved to be most informative.

All in all, despite the many challenges faced, the brethren in the Solomon Islands are joyful and are keeping their faith.



NACare Update

NACare evolves to include ongoing projects

Since its inception, NACare has provided assistance to many communities within Australia and the South Pacific region in response to a variety of natural disasters that have occurred. Over this time, NACare has also been made aware of the need for ongoing support in a number of situations, particularly in the South Pacific nations.

Investigations are currently being conducted into the feasibility of providing assistance in the following areas through specific projects that will help communities over the long term:

Fiji:

It is proposed that NACare provides funding for the purposes of building a cyclone safe building in a village that has a history of being ravaged by cyclonic weather. It would be used for community purposes that are customary in Fijian culture, and in times of natural disasters - such as cyclones or flooding - the building would provide safe shelter for the community.

Solomon Islands:

NACare is proposing to undertake a project to provide ongoing assistance in the area of early childhood education in a local community. This would be in partnership with a local entity

who have an understanding of the needs of the children in the area, taking into account their traditions, customs and circumstances.

These projects do not take the place of our primary mission, which is to offer assistance and financial support in the immediate aftermath of a natural disaster. This mission continues to be an important and ongoing focus for NACare, and we continue to raise awareness of - and provide a timely response to - these situations as they arise.
